Economist

The IMF Resident Representative office in Kyiv has an opening for an **Economist**. This is a full-time contractual position with an initial appointment term of one year (renewable). The selected candidate will play a crucial role in enhancing the IMF's understanding of the Ukrainian economy by monitoring and analyzing macroeconomic, monetary, financial, real and external sector developments. This position requires close collaboration with the National Bank of Ukraine, commercial banks, ministries, market regulators, business associations, and international financial institutions.

Qualifications

- Graduate degree in economics or finance, with a minimum of 5 years of relevant professional or research experience.
- Good understanding of current economic developments in Ukraine, along with a strong grasp of the political and social context. Interest in topics such as monetary policy, exchange rate, macrofinancial linkages, labor and migration trends is a plus.
- Proficiency in maintaining Excel spreadsheets, with attention to details and ability to visualize data.
- Strong quantitative skills, including data analysis. Experience with modeling and econometrics is an advantage.
- Native proficiency in Ukrainian and fluency in English, with ability to draft concise, comprehensive, and analytically clear reports and updates in English.
- Excellent interpersonal, communication and diplomatic skills, and the ability to communicate with government officials.
- Initiative, resourcefulness, drive for results, ability to multitask under pressure, critical thinking and sound judgement in handling confidential information.
