Q1. What is your major and what was your motivation for the application?

I am a second-year student at Columbia University, School of International and Public Affairs, concentrating in International Finance and Economic Policy. Driven by a passion for working at an international organization in the future, I have been seeking internship opportunities that would allow me to experience a multicultural working environment. Among the many international organizations, I chose to apply to the IMF because I am deeply interested in its role in providing macroeconomic policy recommendations to member countries and addressing emerging challenges such as climate change and gender equality.

Q2. What did the application process entail?

I began the application process by submitting a CV, cover letter, samples of my communications work, and two letters of recommendation. After passing the initial screening, I was invited to complete a two-hour written test, where I was tasked with drafting social media posts in English and Japanese and developing a proposal for a communications event. Following this, I participated in a 30-minute online interview, where I discussed my motivation for applying, career goals, my proposal from the written test, and my experience with communications activities.

Q3. What were your main tasks in the internship?

My key tasks as an intern included: 1) creating social media posts for a Japanese staff interview series, highlighting Japanese staff working at the IMF; 2) drafting social media posts featuring quote cards and testimonials from scholars of the Japan-IMF Scholarship Program for Asia (JISPA); and 3) proposing and developing interactive activities for an event booth at Global Festa, Japan's largest international cooperation event. An essential part of my responsibilities was obtaining content clearance from all stakeholders, which involved closely coordinating with Japanese staff, scholars, and colleagues at IMF headquarters to ensure that our messaging was accurate and aligned with the IMF's main goals. In addition to these core tasks, I also drafted an article for the OAP newsletter (published every two months), translated the English OAP website into Japanese during its renewal, and updated OAP leaflets to reflect the latest data.



Q4. What was most memorable from the internship?

The most memorable moment was seeing people enjoy the interactive activities I created for Global Festa. In designing the quizzes and pamphlet, I took time to carefully plan activities that would be engaging, informative, creative, and fun for both adults and children. With over 540 people participating, I felt a sense of accomplishment on having successfully contributed to the communications efforts of the IMF and OAP.

Q5. What did you learn from the internship experience?

I gained first-hand insight into the challenges of the IMF's public relations activities. Macroeconomics is inherently complex and can feel distant from people's everyday lives, making the IMF's work difficult to communicate. While developing activities for Global Festa, I faced the challenge of simplifying the IMF's message without losing its essence. This experience underscored how vital communication is for international organizations: the IMF can only fulfill its mission effectively when it is trusted, and when people have a clear understanding of its work.

Q6. Message to future applicants

This internship offers excellent learning opportunities. Not only will you gain insight into the public relations efforts of an international organization and the work of the IMF, but you will also deepen your understanding of current macroeconomic trends and policy tools through event organization and participation in the Macroeconomist Training Program. Additionally, the workplace environment at OAP is fantastic—my colleagues were incredibly supportive, always willing to help and provide feedback. I am deeply grateful to my peers at OAP for making this internship such a rewarding and educational experience. For anyone interested in gaining experience with international organizations or communications, I highly recommend applying for this role.
