## Maputo headline inflation - December 2011

## Main facts:

- The Maputo headline inflation gained only 1.3 percent at end-2011, the lowest ever December rate since end-1998. As a result, the end of period was curbed at 5.5 percent, well below the 8.4 percent target set for the whole year under the IMF program. The average however remained still above the single digits at 10.4 percent, but it is expected to quickly come down to the single digits still in the first quarter of 2012.
- Food items were the single product category that largely dominated total price increases in December, with a contribution of 96.5 percent.
- Core inflation ${ }^{1}$ consolidated the declining trend observed since the inception of 2011. The end-year figure reached 5.9 percent.
