History of close cooperation

- Financial assistance:
 - 1997: \$20 million in post-conflict assistance
 - 1998 2009: three consecutive IMF lending programs (PRGF) on concessional terms; total borrowing in excess of \$100 million
 - 2005 debt relief from the IMF:
 - \$75 mil under HIPC initiative
 - \$29 mil under multilateral debt relief initiative (MDRI)



History of close cooperation

- Policy dialogue:
 - Semi-annual reviews under the 1998-2009 PRGF
 - This year, Rwanda graduated to a nonborrowing IMF program (Policy Support Instrument or PSI)
 - All recent reports are available on the IMF's website



History of close cooperation

- Technical assistance:
 - Technical advice provided by the short-term and resident experts from the IMF HQ and from AFRITAC – East to the NBR, MINECOFIN, RRA, and NISR
 - Areas of advice have included revenue administration, banking supervision, treasury management, monetary operations, and data compilation



IMF programs – key objectives


- Strong domestic revenue collection

- Structural reforms to support development of the private sector




IMF programs – main achievements


- Successful mobilization of highly concessional donor assistance

- Sustainable external debt position































Remaining challenges


- Low domestic revenues and the corresponding dependence on donor assistance

- High poverty rates














Trade balance projections
