

Mr. Ewart Williams had a 30-year career at the IMF, most of which was spent working on countries in the African and Western Hemisphere Departments. He left the IMF in 2002, as Deputy Director in the Western Hemisphere Department, to become Governor of the Central Bank of Trinidad and Tobago, serving two five year terms (2002-2012). As one of the Government's main policy advisors, Mr. Williams was instrumental in the establishment of the Heritage and Stabilization Fund, which was approved by Parliament in 2007. He served as one of the Governors of the Fund for five years through 2012.

Mr. Williams was Trinidad and Tobago's representative on the International Working Group of Sovereign Wealth Funds (2008-2012) and has participated in several Sovereign Wealth Fund conferences. He currently is the Chairman of the Trinidad and Tobago Campus of the regional University of the West Indies and was recently named a Distinguished Fellow of the University. He holds BSc and MSc degrees in Economics from the University of the West Indies.
